

FHHS Credit Recovery
NON – NEGOTIABLES

1. Attendance is imperative. Students are expected to arrive on time and stay until class ends. 90% class attendance is required to receive credit. Credit recovery classes end at the end of the semester.
2. Participants should keep busy and should not exchange information with others.
3. Students may only access the Plato software while working in the classroom.
4. Students are required to take notes in this class. A legible notebook covering all lessons must be turned in when you finish. Notes may be used on all tests and the final exam. Notebooks must stay in the library writing lab.
5. Electronic devices should be turned off, out of sight, and never in use. Use of cell phones could result in removal from the class or the Credit Recovery Program.
6. Students found using the Internet to look up answers will be warned once. If they are found on the internet again, they could be dropped from the class with NO credit.
7. No food or drink is allowed.
8. Students should bring earbuds or headphones.
9. Language and clothing should always be school appropriate.
10. Students should avoid talking or disturbing others.

In addition to the above rules, all FHSD Student Code of Conduct guidelines will be followed and enforced.
